 flat and/or two) small

 apparently similar to
O. romanchica
 but probably distinct or perhaps
 = *O. prostrata*

This plant is much resembled
 the brown spined *Opuntia* from the
 Llano Estacado, that I neglected to
 note any thing further in reference
 to it. - The joints are orbicular
 and prostrate. - on the areolae
 I find 3-6 stout red spines ^{1-2 1/2 inches long} ~~protruding~~
 which lighten or straw color the
 upper half with occasional
 few small white spines -
 The only specimen of fruit I could
 obtain is imperfect 1 3/4 inches long
 3/4 wide -
 not orbicular - 1-2 lines in diameter
 # areole ^{large} densely covered with reddish brown
 brittle ^{stems} ~~stems~~
 not measured enough
 to make a satisfactory
